Selected from an applicant pool of more than 365 youth from 13 Arab countries, the KAAIYA Fellows have developed innovative solutions to a host of pressing issues - using technology to increase healthcare access in Sudan, equipping Egyptian youth to shape and inform policies, nurturing a spirit of entrepreneurship in Jordan, using dance as a tool to promote healing in Palestine, and more.
