2008 Fellow Bright Simons, co-founder of <u>mPedigree</u>, won the <u>Grand Prix NetExplorateur 2011</u>. The annual award, given out at UNESCO headquarters in Paris, recognizes the world's best digital innovation.

2008 Fellow Nnaemeka Ikegwuonu, founder of the Smallholders Foundation was honored as Nigeria's 'Young Person Of The Year' at the Future Awards on January 30.

The BILGI Young Social Entrepreneur
Awards honored its First Class of Fellows in
Turkey. Hosted by Istanbul Bilgi University, a
member of the Laureate International
Universities network, and supported by the
Sylvan/Laureate Foundation, the Awards
identify young social entrepreneurs who have



succeeded in making positive contributions to their communities. The ten Fellows selected annually receive mentoring to develop their leadership skills, attend customized training programs, and are eligible to receive cash awards to enable them to improve their projects. <u>Learn more</u>.

The <u>Universidad Europea de Madrid Prize for Young Social Entrepreneurs</u> held its 3rd annual awards ceremony honoring ten young leaders who have developed innovative solutions to community challenges in Spain.
